

The Mission Course

Course Purpose

Mission is often perceived as a department of the church, or a task for the elite, but mission doesn't begin with the church. It begins with God: *the Father sent the Son, the Son and the Father sent the Spirit, and the triune God graciously sends the church into the world*. But what does mission entail? Justice, evangelism, work, the Arts? How do we communicate the gospel in resistant culture?

This course will help you develop a missiology as big as the world and as small as your neighborhood. It will train you to share the gospel wisely, personally, and prayerfully, rather than in a rehearsed or formulaic way. It will both expand and particularize your practice of mission.
